

# Answer our 10 big questions



1. What do you think about our vision for North East Cambridge?

6. Do you think that our approach to distributing building heights and densities is appropriate for the location?

**Comment** Too dense, too high buildings, too few green spaces, all are too small. Reminds me of CB around regulation. No sun allowed in. 3rd world looks.



7. Are we planning for the right mix of public open spaces?

Comment

No, certainly not, especially if people are stuck in a flat. It can be shown in the last few months that people need pleasant places to walk & cycle. Milton Country Park is in a village. It is not in Cambridge & is packed now at weekends.

8. Are we doing enough to improve biodiversity in and around North East Cambridge?

Comment

How can you even ask this question?! You want to move a sewage works with all the densification & clearing up that will require + huge blocks of flats. Concrete is an enormous carbon footprint. Then bling pristine Green Belt to rebuild a sewage works !!

9. Are we doing enough to discourage car travel into this area?
